Father's Day BBQ

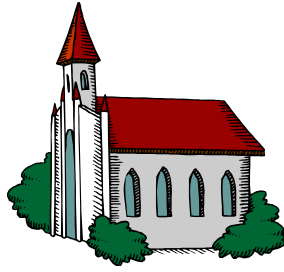
